Grant Applications

The DanPaul Foundation accepts grant applications on a continuous basis. Grant disbursements will be made once or twice yearly depending upon the number of grant applications received. The applications must be consistent with the Mission, Goals and Guidelines established by the Foundation Board of Directors. The Board appreciates applications that are concise, informative and accurate.

Grant disbursements are scheduled to be made once or twice yearly -- if we receive only a few eligible applications, a single disbursement will be made in early July. However, if we receive a large number of eligible applications, two disbursements may be made in early July and early December. Applications should be received by May 1st to be considered for the July disbursement. If a second disbursement is to be made in December, applications received after May 1st but before October 1st will also be considered for that end of the year disbursement. The Board may also choose to make special consideration distributions at other times of the year besides the July and December distribution dates.

If you have any doubts at all that there may be a proper fit between the Foundation's Mission/Goals/Guidelines and your organization's grant request, please send a letter of inquiry first with all the pertinent information and we will respond with a letter to let you know whether to proceed with an actual grant application for your proposal.

Applications must include at least the following information:

- A summary paragraph describing the overall proposal and the amount of funding you are seeking for your project.
- General organization information including:
 - Name & contact information for your organization
 - Description of the organization (who you are and what you do)
 - Current roster and information for your staff and Board of Directors
 - Resume and/or qualifications for the project staff running this program
 - Copy of your most recent financial statements
 - Copy of the organizations' IRS 501(c)(3) ruling
- Project proposal
 - What exactly is being requested?
 - What is the purpose of the request (what will the grant \$\$ be used for)?
 - Provide a proposed project/program budget
 - Provide other potential or confirmed funding sources for this project
 - Provide any other pertinent information you'd like to be considered
