Grant Funding Guidelines

The DanPaul Foundation provides grants to 501(c)(3) tax-exempt / non-profit organizations as defined by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

The Foundation is interested in providing funding for programs that *directly* serve the health, education, development and welfare of the world's youth.

The Foundation does not normally consider grant applications that:

- Request funding for an individual or family
- Request funding for lobbying or election activities
- Request funding for areas outside our goals & interests

Grant Guidelines

1. There are no geographical limitations for grant requests.
2. All applicants must provide proof of tax exempt 501(c)(3) status from the IRS.
3. The Foundation's focus is primarily on programs that benefit the health, education, development and welfare of young people.
4. The Foundation is also interested in providing funding for the education of parents and teachers in the area of early childhood development, for teaching our youth to be socially responsible in regards to the underprivileged and the environment, and to provide ample opportunities for the enrichment of young people's lives.
5. Grants may range from a few hundred dollars up to \$20,000. In unique circumstances, the Foundation would consider a more significant grant for a program having a major impact in our particular areas of interest as outlined in our Mission and Goals.
6. Organizations may be limited to three grants within two calendar years if significant numbers of grant applications are received from organizations providing programs within our Mission and Goals.
